### Vineyard Profile

25% Halberg Vineyard, Sonoma Coast, 25% Four Sisters Vineyard, Sonoma Coast, 25% Dunah Vineyard, Sonoma Coast, 13% Balletto Vineyard, Sonoma Coast, 12% Sangiacomo Roberts Road Vineyard, Sonoma Coast

The Sonoma Coast, a world-renowned growing region southwest of the Russian River and just six miles from the Pacific Ocean is known worldwide for its cool-climate Pinot Noir and microclimates that contribute to slow grape maturation and optimum ripeness.

Small lots of fruit were sourced from five exceptional Sonoma Coast vineyards exclusively for Calstar Cellars Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir.

Each Sonoma Coast vineyard that contributes to the 2007 Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir expresses unique site characteristics including the Sangiacomo Roberts Road Vineyard with early morning sun and daily ocean breeze from the Petaluma gap, Halberg Vineyard with high planting density and coastal fog, Dunah Vineyard impeccably-farmed and planted with Pommard 115 and 667 varietal clones, Balletto Vineyard with rich loam soil and steady winds and the Four Sisters Vineyard located at the southern end of the Sonoma Coast overlooking the San Pablo Bay planted with Swan 115 and 777 clone varietals.

### Winemaker Notes

Bright crimson color and fragrant notes of rose petal and sun-ripened berries with understated flavors of root beer and balanced floral and spiced fruit. This medium-bodied Pinot Noir has a balanced, elegant structure that draws the ripe fruit through a lingering finish of orange peel and earthy warm spice.
