Vineyard Profile

100% Pinot Noir, Londer Vineyard, Anderson Valley

Located twelve miles from the Pacific Ocean, the Londer Vineyard is nestled just northwest of the Mendocino County village of Philo. The 15-acre vineyard is planted on south-facing slopes, in an effort to capture both morning and evening sunlight, important in a cool and often fog-laden microclimate. Due to the nearby Navarro River, the soils are alluvial and sandy on top of clay-based loam, providing an ideal and well-draining environment for Pinot Noir.

Winemaker Notes

Bright crimson in color with glints of violet and rosy pink. This Pinot Noir exhibits classic cool-climate aromas of Bing cherry, raspberry and pomegranate with hints of roast meat and leather. Smooth tannins are well balanced by a sour-cherry acidity and full body. Flavors include orange spice, raspberry, beef stock and vanilla cream soda. A sweet spice note from oak aging draws out a lingering finish. This Pinot Noir is delicious today or for many years to come.
