The Sonoma Coast, a world-renowned growing region southwest of the Russian River and just six miles from the Pacific Ocean is known worldwide for its cool-climate Pinot Noir and microclimates that contribute to slow grape maturation and optimum ripeness. Small lots of fruit were sourced from three exceptional Sonoma Coast and Russian River Valley vineyards exclusively for Calstar Cellars Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir.

Each vineyard that contributes to the 2009 Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir expresses unique site characteristics including the Sangiacomo Roberts Road Vineyard with early morning sun and daily ocean breeze from the Petaluma gap. I have worked with the Vining and Marshall for several years and am proud to have access to these two excellent fruit sources.

Winemaker Notes

Starts with aromas of Bing cherries, cranberries and raspberries underpinned with black tea and sweet baking spice notes. On the palate, zesty acidity lifts notes of bright pomegranate, orange zest and cranberries with hints of minerality and cedarbox. The soft tannins frame the palate nicely and promise to only become more supple with time.
